Community Healthcare Collaborative 2026 Cohort Overview

Program Purpose

The Community Healthcare Collaborative (CHC) is a 13-week capacity-building cohort designed to help healthcare organizations move beyond compliance-based Community Health Needs Assessments (CHNAs) toward measurable community impact.

Through structured learning, applied labs, and expert facilitation, CHC equips participants to close the “Impact Gap” – the widening disconnect between hospital community benefit spending and real-world health outcomes.

The Mission

To empower healthcare leaders to integrate social responsibility, equity, and measurable impact into every level of their community health strategy – turning well-intentioned initiatives into sustainable results.

Who Should Join

The CHC is designed for:

- Hospitals and Health Systems
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)
- Public Health Departments
- Nonprofit Healthcare Collaboratives
- Community-based CHNA Organizations CHNA

Recommended team composition:

- 3-person core team (Community Benefit, Population Health, Strategy)
- 1 - Executive Sponsor or Senior Leader

Program Structure

Duration: 13 Weeks

Format: Virtual cohort with live facilitation, collaborative labs, and implementation guidance

Session Length: 90 minutes weekly, plus bi-weekly Action Labs

Key Components

1. **Assessment & Alignment** – Diagnose your organization’s current social responsibility and CHNA effectiveness using the ISRA framework.
2. **Community Voice Integration** – Learn how to meaningfully include the populations most affected by health disparities.
3. **Strategic Design & Measurement** – Build actionable, measurable community health plans with defined KPIs.
4. **Collaborative Implementation** – Strengthen cross-sector partnerships for greater reach and sustainability.
5. **Sustainability & Reporting** – Develop long-term accountability systems and transparent communication strategies.

Expected Outcomes

By the end of the program, participating organizations will:

- Identify and close key gaps between CHNA goals and outcomes
- Implement authentic community partnership practices
- Strengthen internal collaboration and leadership alignment
- Develop sustainable frameworks for ongoing impact measurement
- Increase grant competitiveness and public trust
